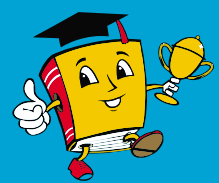


In India a large number of families live with housing insecurity. Many are tribal families or single women raising children, or elderly and disabled people living alone. Although they are often extremely poor, they are also highly resourceful, utilizing discarded materials to construct make-shift shelters. Without even basic safety, however, everyday living is itself a struggle, depleting physical, emotional and financial resources. Every rain brings hardship, disrepair and illness. To end this cycle of distress, hundreds of families have, with the support of AID India, constructed parka (concrete) homes for themselves, transforming their lives.

Devi and Mohan were struggling to manage with their daily wage income. When Mohan had a spinal cord injury, their life fell apart. Devi now had to support her family and also Mohan's treatment. Then, another disaster struck: their hut collapsed during the rains. Hearing about her situation, Aid India team immediately rushed food provisions for the family. After that, Aid India also constructed a house for them. Now, Devi and Mohan are slowly rebuilding their lives and hoping to break out of the cycle of poverty.
